# a. QUALITATIVE DISCLOSURE ON BANK'S LIQUIDITY

Liquidity Coverage Ratio: The LCR standard aims to ensure that a bank maintains an adequate level of unencumbered High Quality Liquid Assets (HQLAs) that can be readily converted into cash at little/no loss of value to meet its liquidity needs for a 30-calendar daytime horizon under a liquidity stress scenario.

### LCR has two components:

- *i.* The value of the stock of High Quality Liquid Assets (HQLA) as a *Numerator*.
- *ii.* Total Net Cash Outflows: Total expected cash outflows minus Total expected cash inflows, in stress scenario, for the subsequent 30 calendar days as a *denominator.*

## Definition of LCR:

Stock of high quality liquid assets (HQLAs) ≥ 100% (w.e.f 01.04.2021)

Total net cash outflows over the next 30 calendar days

The Liquidity Coverage Ratio arrived for the quarter ended September, 2023 was 113.84% (on basis of simple averages of daily observations during the period 01-07-2023 to 30-09-2023) against the regulatory requirement of 100%

The main drivers of LCR of the bank are High Quality Liquid Assets (HQLAs) to meet liquidity needs of the bank at all times and basic funding from retail and small business customers.

### Composition of High Quality Liquid Assets (HQLA)

HQLAs comprises of Level 1 and Level 2 assets. Level 2 assets are further divided into Level 2A and Level 2B assets, keeping in view their marketability and price volatility. Total weighted value (average) of HQLA for the quarter ended September, 2023 is Rs. 2897851 Lakh.

### b. QUALITATIVE DISCLOSURE ON NET STABLE FUNDING RATIO

The NSFR is defined as the amount of available stable funding relative to the amount of required stable funding. "Available stable funding" (ASF) is defined as the portion of capitaland liabilities expected to be reliable over the time horizon considered by the NSFR, which extends to one year. The amount of stable funding required ("Required stable funding") (RSF) of a specific institution is a function of the liquidity characteristics and residual maturities of the various assets held by that institution as well as those of its off-balance sheet (OBS) exposures.

Minimum Requirement of NSFR should be equal to at least 100% on an ongoing basisNSFR= (Available Stable

<u>Funding [ASF])</u> > 100 % Required Stable Funding [RSF]

The minimum NSFR requirement set out in the RBI guideline for the standalone Bank and for Group is 100% w.e.f 1<sup>st</sup> October, 2021.

As on 30<sup>th</sup> September, 2023, PSB maintained weighted Available Stable Funding (ASF) of Rs.10153116 Lakh against the weighted Required Stable Funding (RSF) of Rs. 8485260 Lakh. The NSFR for the quarter ended September 30<sup>th</sup>, 2023 was at 119.66%.
